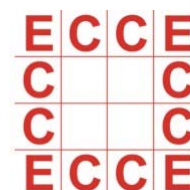


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Call for abstracts and papers

(Key words: ECCE, ECSPRESS, Viennet and other forms of cooperation like joint / double degrees, exchange projects)

III. Managing diversity

(Key words: Interculturality, Cultural Studies, Gender Studies, Inclusion vs. Exclusion, anti-racism)

IV. Social Professions in the political arena

(Key words: civil society, political framework, social work as a political actor, community based social work/policy)

Instructions for authors

The publication targets the higher academic level (years 3-4 university) and should therefore include a critical analysis

Papers written in English, French, German, Italian, are accepted.

The article should not exceed 6000 words

Please submit in any case an abstract of about 200 words in English before September 15th 2010

Please also add a short CV (of not more than 3-5 lines – where you work, what your job is and research interests or publications):
